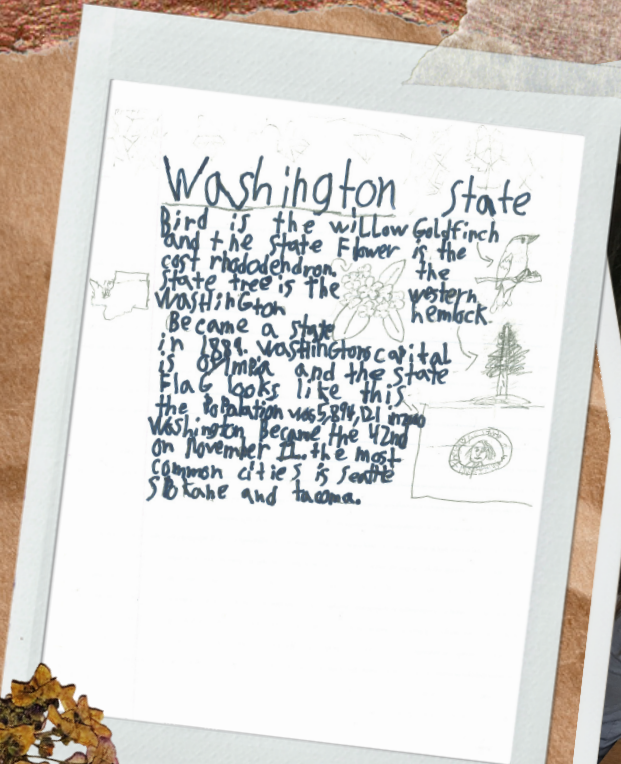

Some Apple Blossoms can produce fruit but they have to cross pollinate. You can call them Apple Blossom or Malus Domestica's. Apple Blossoms are edible.
